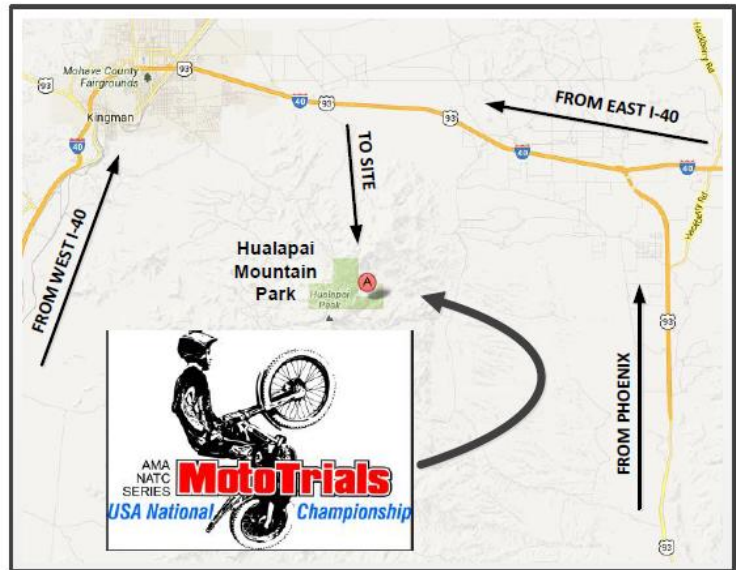

Direction to Trials Site:

Kingman is located in northwestern Arizona, and is directly on I-40. The infamous Route 66 goes right through town; in fact the Host Hotel is directly on Route 66 (Andy Devine Ave). Local airport is Kingman (IGM/KIGM).



- **From Phoenix** – take either Highway 60 (Grand Avenue) directly, or I-17N to the 74 (Carefree Highway), where you will go west to pick up Highway 60N. Continue on the 60N to Wickenburg, and pick up US-93N to I-40W. Take Exit 59S (DW Ranch Road) for 5.5 miles to Hualapai Mountain Road; turn left at this tee intersection and continue climbing 3.8 miles to the Trials Site.
- **From I-40 East** - take Exit 59S (DW Ranch Road) for 5.5 miles to Hualapai Mountain Road; turn left at this tee intersection and continue climbing 3.8 miles to the Trials Site.
- **From I-40 West** Kingman – take Exit 51 Stockton Hill Road South - this turns into Hualapai Mountain Road; follow 12 miles to Trials Site.

What To Bring (primarily geared towards spectators):

Hualapai Mountain Park is at 6,500 feet, and temperatures will be in the range of 55-65°F during the day and 40-50°F during the night. It may be HOT and it may be COLD – come prepared for either. Because of the low humidity and elevation, **it is imperative to stay hydrated at all times.** We cannot emphasize this enough! The sun's rays are more intense up on the mountain, so bring sunscreen or sunblock and cover any unprotected skin. Wide-brimmed hats and sunglasses are recommended, and aspirin for 'elevation' headaches. Wear comfortable clothing as you will be hiking on dirt roads or spectator trails to see the riders, and make sure your camera batteries are fully charged – you will want to capture the riders' amazing skills.

Supplementary Event Rules:

FIRE DANGER IS VERY HIGH!!! NO campfires, NO open flames of any kind and NO smoking. There are areas that are off limits in the park and they will be marked and signed so please, ask before you go. There is no open hiking in the park so you must stay on the rider loop or spectator loop. If you are caught in any of these situations you will be asked to leave the park.

1. The course is closed. Anyone found riding or walking on the course sections before the competition will be disqualified for both days. This includes Riders, Minders or support crew members. Practice areas will be clearly marked for the riders.
2. The rider's and minder's bikes must pass technical inspection; all riders and minders must have a wristband to pass inspection. **Spark Arrestors are mandatory and must be in place at all times.** There will be random checkpoints during the event, and any motorcycle found without a Spark Arrestor will cause that rider's immediate exclusion from the weekend events. Keep in mind the altitude for jetting purposes.
3. No Spectator riding is allowed, either motorcycle or bicycle.
4. All Riders, Minders, Crew, and Workers, must wear a helmet anytime they are riding their motorcycle. This Includes to and from the practice area, in the pits, or anywhere else.
5. Food will be available in the pits during the event.
6. Porta-Potties will be strategically positioned around the Spectator and Riding loops.
7. A Gate Fee of \$10 per day will be charged for everyone attending the events. Children under 12 are Free. Different color-coded wristbands will be given to Spectators, Riders, and Workers. Wristbands should be worn at all times.
8. All Adult event attendees must sign an AMA release upon entering the event site, each day.
9. All minors (under 18 yrs.) must be accompanied by a parent or legal guardian, who must fill out and sign an AMA Minor Release Form.
10. Minor Riders/Competitors who attend the event with a legal guardian must have a copy of a notarized letter,
11. signed by the parents, approving the legal guardian permission for responsibility for their minor competing at this AMA sanctioned competition event.
12. All dogs must be on a leash at all times. Please pick up waste and place it in one of the available trash bins.
13. This event site is a state park that has been gracious in allowing us to hold these two events. It is imperative that we keep the site clean and that we are mindful of others. Thank you for your cooperation!

- Cabins AND Campsites are available at Hualapai Mountain Park on a limited basis. Please call @ 928.681.5700 between Wed-Sun 10am-5pm to make reservations. **Use code word "MOTOTRIALS CAT"** HURRY, they are going fast!
- There is a \$40 Camping Fee.
NOTE: Parking space is limited at the site. Event organizers will try their best to accommodate you and will assist in positioning your vehicles. Those bringing large motorhomes or towing large trailers would be advised to arrive earlier in the week (e.g. Thursday) so that we can get you in place.

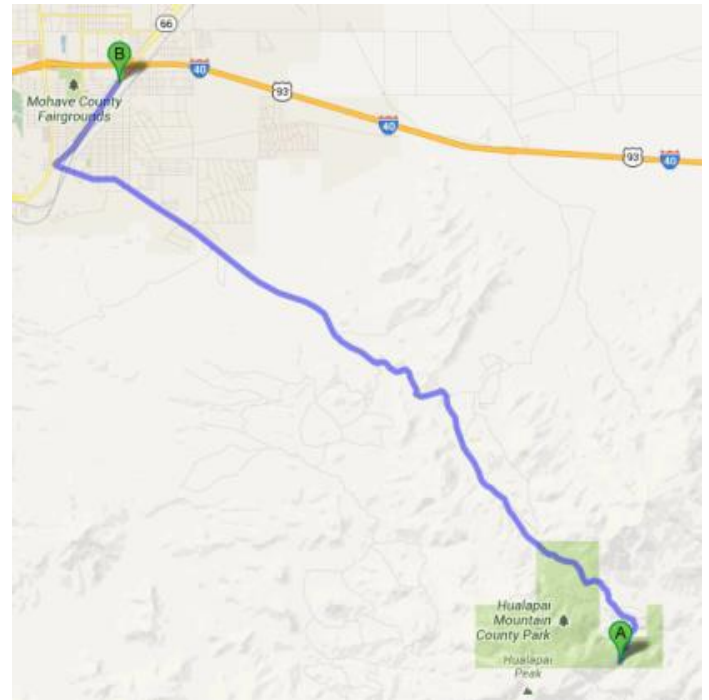
